Answers to commonly asked questions for
Presentation's distance learning plan...



Do families still need to pay tuition even though we are not currently in-person learning?

Yes, families still need to pay tuition in order for Presentation to properly educate your children and pay our teachers. Our teachers and staff are working endlessly on lesson planning and preparing material for our students.

Do families still need to pay a technology fee even if using their personal technology devices?

Yes, families still need to pay technology fee because it does not only cover the devices but the software subscriptions used to educate your children.

What if someone in a family's house gets sick or is exposed to COVID-19 during distance learning? Do I still have to report to the school?

Yes, families still have to report any exposure or illness in the household so Presentation can properly report to the state health department, follow proper protocol, and support our families.

What happens if a family has technical difficulties?

If a family is having technical difficulties please contact Presentation's front office to help solve the problem. Our teachers will be focused on class so our front office will help with any technical difficulties that arise.

What if supplies or materials are needed from the school that families still have to pick up?

Families can properly pick up materials at Presentation during our scheduled pick up and drop off times. Any extras, please contact the front office.

How do families manage a student at home expected to complete assignments with working parents?

Agree on a schedule that best suits your family and lifestyle. Choose a quiet place, free from distractions, to work on school assignments. This space should be a dedicated space for school only. Be sure to check in with your child each day on his/her assignments through journaling and keeping a checklist. Take breaks, go outside and get some exercise, play some games, cook, draw, and enjoy family time. Finally consider creating a Distance Learning Cohort with 1-2 other families from Presentation.
